and other charities; Danny Bakewell and Brotherhood Crusade; La Raza representatives.

- VI. Audience: To be recruited from the general public with special emphasis on communities of color.
- VII. Budget: Electronic/computer equipment, audiovisual and media technicians, Master of Ceremonies honorarium, professional production assistants, publicity, and public relations consultants are estimated to cost \$20,000.
- VIII. Sponsorship levels:

Platinum: \$20,000 or more: Sole source sponsorship of the event. Public announcement of the sponsor's generosity during the event and in all print and broadcast media.
