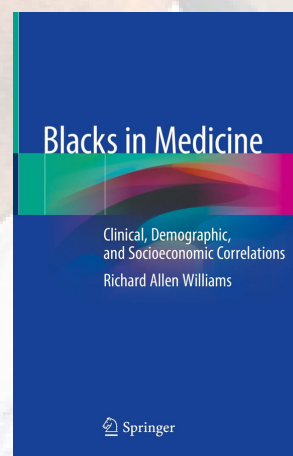


# DR. RICHARD ALLEN WILLIAMS

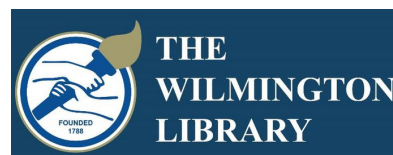

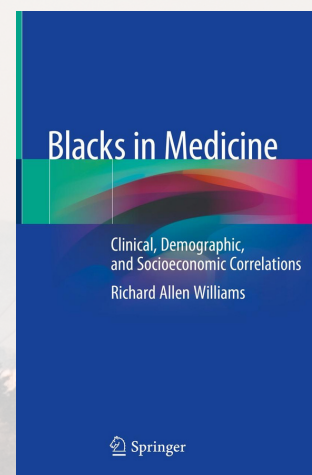
